## This funding will be used to

- Employ undergraduate and postgraduate Griffith University science students to:
  - (i) 'value add' to the learning experience of participating senior students in select programs (e.g. Ecological Sampling Techniques, Landcover Transformations)
  - (ii) enable more efficient allocation of teaching resources to cater for increased demand for centre programs

## Our initiatives include

- Reviewing the delivery of year 11/12 student programs to determine:
  - (i) efficiencies in the allocation of human resources e.g. teachers, role of GU students, unit support officer
  - (ii) alignment with the newly introduced Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) senior Biology and Geography curricula
- It is anticipated that improvements in these programs will be evidenced in:
  - (i) an increase in the numbers of senior students accessing centre programs
  - (ii) cumulative qualitative feedback received from visiting teachers (Likert scale)
